RE: APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM 2/23/2021

Minutes of the previous meeting were mailed to the Council Members prior to the meeting for their review. Don Kring made a motion seconded by Ron Parker to approve the minutes as presented. Motion passed with Five (5) ayes and No (0) nays.

RE: SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL CONTRACT

Mayor Dennis Estok talked to the Council about the City's contract with Waste Management for garbage and recycle pickup. The main concern is the cost of recycling. The Council Members agreed that work sessions will be needed to update the City's specifications.

RE: MAYOR'S REPORT

- 1) Housing, I had zoom meeting with HCDA about tax credits not being an option for the City. It is very competitive and small towns/city score is low. Other options are available, we will continue looking at them.
- 2) New stimulus bill may pass senate tomorrow and then the President must sign it. It could mean a good cash flow for the City of Knox.
- 3) Spring Leaf Pick up scheduled for the first week of April and the first week of May.
